Andropogon gerardii 'Dancing Wind' Dancing Wind Big Blue Stem

Andropogon gerardii 'Dancing Wind' (Dancing Wind Big Blue Stem) is a stately prairie grass that provides strong vertical structure and form in the garden year round. Compared to the straight native, this cultivar is slightly shorter and produces a much more vibrant display of fall color. From late summer through early winter, the tall blades of grass and architectural seed heads appear to dance in the wind, bringing movement and flow. Big Blue Stem is a warm-season grass with fresh green foliage in late spring that transitions from yellow-green in summer to bright, fiery red in fall. It is nicknamed "turkey foot" because its distinctive fall seed heads resemble the splayed toes of a turkey's foot. The foliage and interesting seed heads remain upright until the first heavy snow. The straight native species is a host plant for several species of skipper butterflies, and the seeds and foliage support birds and mammals. Pairs well with summer-blooming prairie plants like Butterfly Milkweed and Tall Coreopsis, and provides support for tall fall blooming plants like New England Aster.

Additional notes: Dense clump grasses provide nesting sites for birds and overwintering habitat for butterflies. Limited nursery availability, but other varieties are available. Companion plants: Butterfly Milkweed (Asclepias tuberosa), New England Aster (Aster novae-angliae), Tall Coreopsis (Coreopsis tripteris), Blazing Star (Liatris spicata), Black-eyed Susan (Rudbeckia hirta), Little Bluestem (Schizachyrium scoparium)
