Astilbe chinensis 'Vision in Pink' Vision in Pink Astilbe

Astilbe chinensis 'Vision in Pink' (Vision in Pink Astilbe) is a clump-forming perennial that features clouds of soft-pink plumes emerging from graceful fern-like mounds. The attractive blue-green foliage is composed of compound leaves with sharply-toothed leaflets. The tiny flowers begin to emerge in early summer and develop into dense, full pink panicles in July and August, providing a vibrant display of feathery color. Growing from 2-3 feet tall, Astilbe is a slow-spreading rhizomatous plant that does best in partial shade. 'Vision in Pink' is more tolerant of drier soils than other Astilbe cultivars, but must have rich, acidic soils to ensure success. Looks dreamy in large groups where colorful clouds of flowers create an impressionistic look. Deer tolerant and beneficial for butterflies and bees. Panicles of dried brown seed heads persist into winter.
