## Baptisia leucantha White Wild Indigo

Baptisia leucantha (White Wild Indigo) stems emerge from the soil as attractive gray-green stalks topped with bright green leaf bunches and a holding already formed flower buds. As the foliage expands, the flower buds elongate to a towering inflorescence with pea-like flowers that open from its base to tip over several weeks. After pollination, flowers produce showy oblong dark brown pods by early fall, each holding seeds that rattle in the wind. Wait until late winter to cut back stems for lovely winter form. The beautiful velvet green foliage on this shrub-like perennial offers a backdrop to highlight other summer-blooming perennials. Baptisia leucantha is a long-lived, native perennial that grows 3-4 feet tall and 2-3 feet wide, with an erect and clumping form. It prefers full sun to light shade and poor, sandy soils but can grow on any non-acidic soil type with good drainage. It is tolerant of drought, deer, salt and heat. Baptisia is a nitrogen-fixing genus offering additional ecosystem services of food and shelter to birds, bees and butterflies.
