## Limonium latifolium Sea Lavender

The delicate blossoms of Limonium latifolium (Sea Lavender) create a soft, purple haze, lasting from July through September. Dense cloud-like sprays of minute lavender-blue flowers are at their peak around August and September. A variety of short-tongued bees and butterflies are attracted to the flowers. Large, glossy green, paddle-shaped basal rosette leaves form an attractive groundcover in early spring. In fall, leaves and stems transition to a bright or burnt red color. Great to tuck in among other perennials as the low foliage remains mostly hidden and allows the flowers to stand out. Often used as a backdrop for taller, rougher textured plants, it can also be used as a stand-alone plant when a soft texture is desired along a border edge of a garden. It grows best in full sun, dry to moist, well-drained conditions. Drought, deer, salt, and heat tolerant.
