Persicaria amplexicaulis 'Alba' Alba Mountain Fleece

Persicaria amplexicaulis 'Alba' (Alba Mountain Fleece) provides a bushy form and long-blooming presence in the garden. Twisting spikes of tiny, white flowers (6" long) float above lush, oval-shaped, tapering leaves that clasp the stems. The delicate blooms last throughout July and until the first frost, providing an airy lightness to plantings from summer through fall. Bees and other pollinators are attracted to the nectar of Persicaria species. Good for use in masses as a tall ground cover in full to part sun conditions. Prefers moist to wet soils, making it well-suited for pond, stream, or rain garden edges. Can be sensitive to drought and heat, so plants appreciate ample moisture and part shade in warmer climates. Pairs well with late-blooming flowers such as Asters, Joe Pye Weed, and Goldenrods, as well as light textured grasses like Moor Grass.
