Scutellaria incana Downy Skullcap

Scutellaria incana (Downy Skullcap) is a showy native wildflower that is right at home in dappled shade gardens. Pairs of violet-blue, tubular flowers (1" long) appear on clusters of terminal spikes (6" long) for 4-6 weeks from July to September. Flowers attract mostly bumblebees, but occasionally small butterflies. This upright plant features ovate, opposite leaves (3" long) that give the plant a lush appearance. Compared to other Skullcaps, Downy Skullcap blooms later and grows taller (2-3'). Plants spread via underground rhizomes to slowly fill in. This plant prefers part shade and well-drained soils, but can tolerate a range of soil types, as well as full sun. Foliage is bitter tasting, which deters most herbivores, and established plants are drought and heat tolerant. Downy Skullcap is a hardy, beautiful plant that brings long-blooming interest to dry, shady areas.

(Waldsteinia fragarioides).
