Trollius x cultorum 'New Moon' New Moon Globe Flower

Trollius x cultorum 'New Moon' (New Moon Globe Flower) boasts large (2.5" across), buttercup-like flowers in early spring and is perfect for the rain garden, pond edge, or shoreline garden. New Moon Globe Flower has glossy basal leaves, and all foliage is textured with deep dissections. Blooms appear from May to June and attract bees, butterflies, and other pollinators. Darker yellow stamens reach out from the center of each wide-petaled flower that blooms above a strong, unbranched, upright stem. This plant thrives in full sun to part shade and wet soils, and is perfectly suited for moist woodland or pond-side gardens. Pair with other moisture-loving plants, like ferns, turtleheads, and iris.
